# Commodore's Regatta Results

Ten boats in three classes raced in the Commodore's Regatta on April 4 and 5. Beautiful weather and good wind enabled the Race Committee to conduct five races averaging about 45 to 60 minutes each. Courses were mixed between Olympic and Windward-Leeward with common starts for all three fleets, Spinnaker, Non-Spinnaker, and Dinghy.

Karen McCullough and Barbara McCollum and their crew prepared a great dinner on Saturday evening and a breakfast on Sunday morning. Jane Glenn got everyone registered and sugared up with some fudge brownies. Horace Holland fabricated a new starting mark which was used for the first time in this regatta.

The wind was blowing about 13-17 out of the west at noon, prompting much rearrangement of crew plans and spinnaker designations before the skippers' meeting. The Race Committee had a perfect course set prior to the skippers' meeting, but the wind shifted and diminished before the first start. The course was reset and the first race was sailed in light breeze with Willson Jenkins skippering his Flying Scot well ahead of all fleets.

The second and third races were sailed with more breeze in the Beaufort 2-3 range under abundant sunshine. Paul Wunsch and his Capri 30 crew sped around the course first in Race Two followed closely by Yves Morrisette single-handing his J-80. Paul was speedy again in the third race, but corrected to second after Tommy and Hayden Glenn dialed in their SJ-24. The Gillingham's were first to finish in the non-spinnaker fleet in Race 3 followed only seconds behind by Joel VerPlank. Joel had the last laugh when the handicaps were factored. He won all three races in his fleet on Saturday.

Nolan and Willson were tied in the Dinghy fleet after two races with each winning one race. Nolan had a great third race, winning it while Dave Seborg took second.
