

MARINA RULES

- 1 Class A club members in good standing may request a slip or slip change by contacting the Sail Master. Request for slips by Class A members will be honored before requests from Jr. members are considered. Slips will be assigned as they become available.
- 2 The Sail Master will establish a waiting list in the event there are no slips available. You must be a Class A member in good standing to be on the waiting list. The member at the top of the list shall have first choice of a vacant slip. If he chooses not to claim this slip, the choice will go to the second name on the list and so on. The member whose name is first on the list will retain his standing on the list and can be assigned the next available slip.
- 3 Slip allocation is membership specific and cannot be transferred. No member shall represent the slip as accompanying the purchase of a boat. The Sail Master must be notified if you are buying or selling a boat stored on club property,
- 4 A slip will be declared vacant if it is not occupied or the slip fee paid within 30 days of being assigned. The Sail Master can grant an extension in some circumstances.
- 5 Any boat judged a navigational or safety hazard by the Board will be removed to a place deemed safe.
- 6 Members who are in arrears with dues or storage fees may have their boats secured until such they are paid.
- 7 No part of a boat docked in a slip will extend over or under the dock or walkway.
- 8 Boats sailing out of the MSSC shall conform to all club, state and federal safety regulations.
- 9 When using the ramp and flotation dock, move your boat as far forward as possible allowing other boats to dock behind you. Please keep the ramp and launch area free of cars and trailers so others can use them.
- 10 You may moor your boat on the floating dock or at the rear of the harbor if bad weather prevents you from returning to your slip. Please move your boat to its proper slip as soon as possible.
- 11 Do not leave your boat moored at the floating dock for more than 24 hours without permission from the Sail Master.
- 12 Do not park so as to block a dry-sailors access to his space.
- 13 Please maintain silence in the harbor at night. Secure your rigging.
- 14 Club boats and equipment are available to members in good standing after they have been instructed in their safe and proper use. Return all equipment to its proper storage after using. Report all problems with club equipment to the Sail Master.
- 15 Fishing from the docks is allowed under direct supervision of a club member. Respect member's space and boats when fishing.
- 16 The Board must approve additions or changes to the docks, including dock boxes or other structures.
- 17 A transient slip fee of up to .50 cents per foot per day may be assessed to all nonmembers' boats occupying a slip. Members using slips not assigned to them for more than five days must receive permission from the Sail Master or be subject to this fee.
